

has prepared an introductory article later in this newsletter.



Inter-club bowls challenge: This event is currently in progress and I would



Chris Gordon was chosen again for the State Senior side and Genevieve Delves the Country V City side.


As you can see by the above we have done well.

Selectors Report



It’s come to that time of the year again when the Selectors have

to nominate our Pennant sides for next year’s competition.

The list has been up on the main notice Board and after a few long meetings and plenty of discussions it has been decided that we enter 6 sides in next year’s competition, Grades 2 -7 for Board approval.

Unfortunately numbers are down on last year’s availability for Pennants and with the loss of a couple of key players who have transferred to other clubs and with keeping the Club’s best interests in mind, the decision to enter 6 teams only was made.

There have also been a few changes to the Conditions of Play for next season; the main notable changes are as follows:

Clause 2.29 – Restricting Movement of Players

After delivering their first bowl, players will only be allowed to walk up to the head under the following circumstances:

- 2.29.1 – Singles game
After delivery of their third and fourth Bowls
- 29.2.2 – Pairs game
Leads – After delivery of their second and fourth bowls
Skips – after delivery of their second, third and fourth bowls
- 29.29.3 – Triples Game (2 bowls)
Leads – after delivery of their second bowl
Seconds – after delivery of their second bowl
Skips – after delivery of each of their bowls
- 29.29.4 – Fours Game
Leads – after delivery of their second bowl
Seconds – after delivery of their second bowl

Thirds – after delivery of their second bowl. The third for each team may stand at the head end until it is their turn to play

Skips – after delivery of each of their bowls

29.29.5 – Players remaining at head end

When a player at the head walks up to the mat to deliver their first bowl, their direct opponent can remain at the head until that bowl has come to rest before walking up to the mat to deliver their first bowl.

Clause 2.24 – Personal Electronic Devices/Communication Devices
Personal Electronic Devices/Communication Devices shall not be taken onto the green or surrounds in an “active” mode during the playing of any association match, except with the explicit approval of the controlling body.

Clause 4.7 – Timetable
The side managers shall be at the Venue Club not less than forty (40) minutes before the starting time of the event.

The side managers shall advise the Controlling body of the draw and allocation of rinks not less than thirty

(30) minutes before the starting time of the event

Trial ends shall commence not later the twenty (20) minutes before the starting time of the event.


HBCCC will also be participating in interclub bowling challenge run by Harbord Bowling Club.


Keira Trim was selected into the NSW PSSA team this year and NSW came 2nd at Nationals in Melbourne, just last week.

Our once a month fishing competition is well attended at the weigh in at the “Bowlo” and brings in fishermen from all over the peninsula attempting to win our coveted awards.


Those that attend the weigh in get a free sausage sandwich even if they did not catch any fish.

HARBORD FRIGID FROGS WINTER SWIMMING CLUB



On Sunday, September 18th this year the Harbord Frigid Frogs

competed in the 2016 Australian Winter Swimming Championships at

Charlestown pool, just south of Newcastle. These annual titles bring together winter swimming clubs from NSW, QLD & WA to compete in events that include individual races & relays for both males & females. The age groups competing range from Over 18's to Over 85's. Many of the swimmers have represented Australia in swimming, surf life-saving & water polo at Olympic level & in many Australian teams.

This year the manager of the Freshwater Community Bank – Sandy Kleiner, competed for the Frigid Frogs in both individual & relay events. Sandy was rewarded with Silver & two Bronze medals for her efforts, including competing against younger opposition with distinction!

The Frogs won the Male Points Score result whilst the Female team finished a very credible fourth given the number of swimmers they had. All of the ladies had to “double up” & compete against other clubs in multiple events in all the age groups.

This is the 14th time that the club has won the Championship Pennant since the formation of the Winter Swimming Association in 1976 & the holding of the annual championships.




Just prior to that, a much smaller team headed off to the Red Centre to represent our club at the Alice Springs Masters Games. As one team member reported at the time “each day after swimming gold, silver and bronze medals were presented by the Mayor, Deputy Mayor, and Dawn Fraser, among others. Such an honour to be a recipient but what we were most thrilled with was the gold medal for the two relays we entered, medley and freestyle, both of which were ASMG records. Can it get any better? I think not.” Not only was it a fabulous swimming experience the girls toured the area gaining a knowledge and insight into the local culture.

With the travel bug still active, 6 swimmers headed off to Hamilton Island in November to compete in an ocean race and party too.

And finally, another aspect of our club – Time Trials - once a year the club gives us the opportunity to swim longer distances and be officially timed; you can swim 200m, 400m and 800m distances. These swim times can then be added to your personal swim record and submitted to the State office for recognition. This can lead to finding yourself in the Top Ten for the State, National and World records. It is also an opportunity to stretch yourself and have a go.
