



2017 National Youth Archery Championships CONDITION OF ENTRY

These Conditions of Entry are designed to enable the 2017 National Youth Archery Championships will be conducted smoothly and safely providing the best possible environment ensuring everyone enjoys the archery experience and allowing them to perform to the best of their ability.

- All Venues are non-smoking, except in designated areas.
- Anyone under the influence of alcohol or drugs will not be permitted into the Venue or will be directed to leave.
- Follow all directions or instructions given by the Organising Committee, Judges or Archery Australia personal. Refusal to follow instructions may result in removal from the Venue.
- Children under 12 years must be accompanied and supervised by an adult at all times.
- Car parking is at your own risk; vehicles must be locked at all times.
- You must not cause willful damage or harm to any part of the Venue including buildings, fixtures & fittings, fences, vegetation and infrastructure during the event.
- The Organising Committee reserves the right to inspect clothing, containers, packages and bags intended to be bought into Venue.
- All promotional, commercial, political, religious or offensive items of whatever nature including, but not limited to, clothing, banners, signs, symbols and leaflets are prohibited and must not be used for display purposes or bought into Venue.
- There will be a zero tolerance policy towards any inappropriate behaviour, which may include but is not limited to:
 - **Harassment and Intimidation**
 - **Berating**

- **Abuse**
- **Bullying**
- **Profanity**
- **Sledging**
- **Persistently or willfully questioning or challenging the rulings of the officials**

GLOSSARY

Harassment and Intimidation as viewed in the eyes of the complainant covers a wide range of behaviors of an offensive nature. It is commonly understood as behaviour intended to disturb or upset, and it is characteristically repetitive. In the legal sense, it is intentional behaviour, which is found threatening or disturbing.

Berating means censure severely or angrily usually publicly.

Abuse is the improper usage or treatment of another for a bad purpose, often to unfairly or improperly gain benefit. Abuse can come in many forms, such as: physical or verbal maltreatment or causing injury.

Bullying is a form of aggressive behavior manifested by the use of force or coercion to affect others, particularly when the behavior is habitual and involves an imbalance of power. It can include verbal harassment, physical assault or coercion and may be directed repeatedly towards particular victims, perhaps on grounds of age, race, religion, gender, sexuality, or ability. The "imbalance of power" may be social power (age or ability) and/or physical power.

Profanity also known as **swearing, cursing or foul speech**, is a show of disrespect, a desecration or debasement of someone or something, or just the act of expressing intense emotions. Profanity can take the form of words, expressions, gestures, or other social behaviors that are socially constructed or interpreted as insulting, rude, vulgar, obscene, obnoxious, foul, desecrating or other forms

Sledging is a term used to describe the practice whereby some competitors seek to gain an advantage by insulting or verbally intimidating another competitor. The purpose is to try to weaken the competitor's concentration, thereby causing him to make mistakes or underperform

In the first instant a warning or direction to cease will be issued. Continued inappropriate behaviour or failure to comply with the warning or directions will result in a competitor's being disqualified from the event and asked to leave the Venue or non-competitors or spectator's being asked to leave the Venue. This may also result in further action in line with the Archery Australia Member Protection Policy. In extreme cases the Police or appropriate authorities may be called.

- You must wear appropriate footwear (enclosed shoes) at all times within the Venue.
- The taking of images is permitted but must comply with the Archery Australia Photography Policy.
- Upon entering this Venue you consent to being photographed, filmed and recorded and consent to use of any such film, image or recording at the discretion of Archery Australia and the Organising Committee or its commercial partners or law enforcement agencies without compensation or notice.

This Condition of Entry policy applies to all venues used as part of the 2017 National Youth Archery Championships.

NOTE - Conditions of entry are subject to change without notice. Management reserves the right to refuse entry. Refusal to comply with these conditions of entry may result your removal from the Venue.
