



ARCHERY South Australia Inc CLUB GRANTS SCHEME 2018

(Application Period: 1 November, 2017 – 30 June, 2018)

Eligible clubs may apply to ARCHERY SA on an annual basis, or as otherwise determined from time to time, for grants monies derived from the interest that is generated by the funds that ARCHERY SA has invested.

- The scheme will be managed by the Grants Committee, which shall report to ARCHERY SA
- An eligible Club is one that is Incorporated and affiliated with ARCHERY SA and has been in operation for more than 12 months, with more than 10 affiliated members
- Applications open each year on 1 November and close 30 June
- A Club which is unsuccessful in one year, is eligible to seek a grant in the following year
- The grants will only come from interest earned by ARCHERY SA
- The maximum grant money available in total shall be no more than 50% of the interest earned by ARCHERY SA in the previous financial year
- The maximum grant available per application is 10% of the available funds
- The grant will be for funding activities that **benefit and promote the sport in general**, rather than an individual or normally funded club activity. An example would be advertising and running a “Come & Try” or hosting a Coaching Programme
- The successful applicant(s) will be required to submit a report to the Grants Committee that outlines the activity/program for which the grant was provided. Failure to present a report may prejudice future applications
- The operation of this Policy was reviewed by the Grants Committee in 2017, after the fourth funding period.

(Please note: Applications to improve facilities and equipment, other than coaching equipment, are not eligible under this scheme. Refer to example projects next page)

Total interest earned: \$11,148.76

Total available funds for the 2018 funding period: \$5,574.38

Maximum Grant, Per Club:-\$557.44

The proposal should be made by the Club and

1. explain how it is consistent with the aims of benefiting and promoting the sport AND
2. specify the date when the funds will be utilised AND

CLUB GRANTS SCHEME

Applications will be considered on a first come/first served basis.

FUNDING PRIORITIES

1. Club Grants that have a strong emphasis on reaching under-represented sectors of the community, including:
 - Socio-economically disadvantaged
 - Persons with disabilities
 - First Australians
 - Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD)
 - Geographically isolated communities
 - Females.
2. Projects have tangible measures to show impact in the community
3. Projects/programs show a level of sustainability
4. Applicant body and partnering organisations have the capacity to successfully undertake the project

Example projects may include:

- Coaching bursaries or subsidies for individuals (sponsored by the applying Club) or groups who would otherwise face obstacles to participation (see funding priority 1). Funds may be used for coaching, membership fees and participation in tournaments or travel. Max \$500 per individual
- Participation programs aimed at underserved sectors listed in funding priority 1
- Projects using archery as a vehicle to impact community engagement or participation e.g. "After school homework Club" held before archery activities, archery lessons for identified cultural groups to help adjust to life in Australia, archery program for families where a member has a disability, etc
- Infrastructure to directly and positively impact inclusion and diversity participation
- Equipment to support program delivery will be considered in context of an overall project (equipment alone is not eligible for funding).
