General Manager's Report

Another busy month at the club with some good sales across the bar as well as the Friday Night Bistro. Earlier in the month our kitchen staff delivered 135 meals on a single Friday night, in recent weeks it has come back to its average of around 80 meals per Friday. Hopefully it will kick back up again this week off the back of a couple of group bookings – look out for the Northern Tigers u12 football team who will be joining us this Friday night.

The October month saw bar sales reach \$28,277, an increase over the previous month of \$24,204 but significantly higher than the \$17,583 in sales in October 2018. A variety of factors lead to this result including the promotional work we did around the Rugby World Cup and the continued success of our new craft beer – peaking at 2 kegs per week.

At the same time Gaming revenue was well down on the same period last year – \$17,645 (Oct 19) v \$29,327 (Oct 18).

The end result for the October month was a loss of \$1,859, taking the year to date accumulated loss to \$32,194. Though heading in the right direction, this clearly is not sustainable and again reminds us of the need for change.

On the more positive side, we are laying the foundations to turn this around with the Board's recent approval of our new catering. The kitchen will be open for dinner Thursday/Friday/Saturday commencing January and we will then look at further opportunities once the new team has settled in. Catering needs to be at the centre of the club's strategy and I am excited about the opportunities that lay ahead.

The other foundation that has been laid is the 50%+ increase in our social membership in November with the strategic partnership with Northern Tigers Football Club – yes around 230 new social members were signed up over one weekend. This number is continuing to grow each week. A massive step forward for the club and one which is already contributing to our bottom line.

FURTHER INFORMATION re OPEN GENDER POLICY for 2020 ASSOCIATION EVENTS

The following points, in no particular order, were advised to those in attendance at the Zone 9 meeting with Bowls NSW representatives David Ellis and Andrew Lynn on 7th November 2019. This information is additional to that included in the Notice of 31st October, 2019 that a Special General Meeting of the Turrumurra Men's Bowling Club to be held on Saturday 7/12/19 @ 4pm.

1. 2020 open gender arrangements have no bearing on the protracted amalgamation process with WBNSW.
2. Bowls NSW has a Fixed Fee model (not due for review until 2022) for registered bowlers so registering of new / additional bowlers will not incur association fees.
3. A female may join Bowls NSW without being a member of WBNSW (but then may only play in Bowls NSW events).
4. Bowls Australia dictate that females registered with BNSW & WBNSW can choose to play in **either** (not both in the same year) Bowls NSW or WBNSW State Championships in any discipline e.g. Females can play in Bowls NSW State Singles and then play in WBNSW Pairs etc.
5. M & F Umpires: Approval enabling any Bowls Australia registered Umpire Presenter who is also registered with Bowls NSW (e.g. Sue Hamilton), can train and accredit male applicants. Similar approval is anticipated in relation to Coaches.
6. It is anticipated that weekend participation will increase due to encouraging workers to play open gender pennants etc. The first year in Vic Metro participation was down 8% but increased by 34% in year 5. We can only hope!

A further Bowls NSW Circular subsequently received (i.e. #16/2019 dated 15/11/19) reinforces its commitment to promoting bowls as an inclusive sport and regulations to allow female membership is to enable more opportunities for women to participate, particularly on weekends.

As a result of enquiries as to whether Clubs are required to allow female bowlers in 'social' or 'gala' events conducted by Clubs on days which have traditionally been 'men's' days; *"The position of Bowls NSW is that any female who is accepted by an affiliated Club as a member and who registers with Bowls NSW, should be entitled to participate in regular Social or Gala events which are conducted by the Club, and given the same membership privileges as any other registered member of the Club."*

Bowls NSW expects all Clubs to be aware of and comply with their legal obligations under the relevant anti-discrimination legislation, including the Sex Discrimination Act 1984 (Cth) and the Anti-Discrimination Act 1977 (NSW).


MAHJONG and CARD DAY





Our numbers fluctuate so we are always wanting card players (make up a foursome), also anyone wanting to learn to play Mahjong, Jenny is always willing to teach.

VALE Helen Nagle

Living on Bobbin Head Road, being so near to Turramurra Bowling Club made it natural that Neville and Helen join the Club (at that time due to liquor licensing laws a woman could only join a licensed club with her husband), *back* then Bowling Clubs were the hub of the community. Helen joined the Club in February 1971.

Within her first year Helen joined the Social Committee organising card days, Helen held various positions on the committee for the next 15 years, culminating in being President for the Club's 30th Anniversary celebrations in 1985. She came back onto the Committee later and took over the organisation of the Trading Table which held weekly raffles and is a way the Club raises money for use in the club and for charity. Helen found this very rewarding. The Trading Table continues to operate.

During that late 80's Helen was on the Mid North Shore District Social Committee organising district "*President's Days*" at various clubs on the mid north shore. In 1986 Helen joined the Past Club Presidents Association of NSW, she served a term as president here and for more than 10 years represented Mid West (Dubbo) as their Country Delegate at State Council Meetings.

Helen's dedication and long distinguished history of service to the Club was recognised when she was granted Life Membership of the ladies' club in 1994, and when her husband Neville was awarded Life Membership of TBC in 2001, they became the first and only husband and wife to be so honoured. Helen was appointed as co-Patron of the ladies' club in 2001 when the then Patron's health had deteriorated.

In 2006 Helen received another historic accolade – she was appointed both Patron and Life Member of not only the ladies club but also the TBC Limited – the first lady to hold both of these positions simultaneously.

In 2000 Helen was awarded the Australian Sports Medal. This commemorative medal was introduced to recognise Australian sporting achievements. The medal acknowledged a range of Australians who, in different ways, contributed to the nation's sporting success. Recipients included former competitors, coaches, sports scientists, office holders, and people who maintain sporting facilities and services. An achievement Helen was very proud of.

Helen had a long list of bowling achievements to her credit. For those of you who know bowls a lead is a very important position in a team and Helen was recognised as "the best lead in the Club" she was part of the team that won the State Wollinski Shield in 1998 – the only State event to be won by the Club. Helen won the Minor Singles in 1974 and was a member in teams playing in many club finals of Pairs, Triples and Fours, she also played lead in Turramurra's Number 1 Pennant Team for many years.

Helen was a quiet achiever. She always had a kind word to say about anyone at any time. It was hard to believe that someone so gentle was so die hard competitive on the green who would not be out bowled by anyone. When she could no longer get on the green to bowl Helen religiously walked to the club to sell raffle tickets, creating beautiful floral arrangements, watch the bowls and give a friendly word of encouragement / words of wisdom, a smile welcoming visitors and thoughtful words of wisdom for new members. She enjoyed lunch with her other family - her bowling family.

In recent years when Helen relocated to Corlette her interest in all the happenings at the club continued receiving a copy of the TBC Gazette by post.

I know we have lost one of the kindest, most respected lady of our Club.






1- Auto repair shops will disappear.

28- Most traditional car companies will doubtless become bankrupt. They will try the evolutionary approach and just build a better car, while tech companies (Tesla, Apple, Google) will do the revolutionary approach and build a computer on wheels.

29- Look at what Volvo is doing right now; no more internal combustion engines in their vehicles starting this year with the 2019 models, using all electric or hybrid only, with the intent of phasing out hybrid models.

30- Many engineers from Volkswagen and Audi are completely terrified of Tesla and they should be. Look at all the companies offering all electric vehicles. That was unheard of, only a few years ago.

31- Insurance companies will have massive trouble because, without accidents, the costs will become cheaper. Their car insurance business model will disappear.

32- Real estate will change. Because if you can work while you commute, people will abandon their towers to move far away to more beautiful affordable locations.

33- Electric cars will become mainstream about 2030. Cities will be less noisy because all new cars will run on electricity.

34- Cities will have much cleaner air as well.

35- Electricity will become incredibly cheap and clean.
