


As each game is played, the results are not only updated on the Notice Board but on our Club website too, under 'Bowling Program'.

Over the past month we have replaced the office Laser printer with a larger mono one which is a lot cheaper on consumables. The larger size requires less interaction due to increased toner capacity plus two full ream paper trays. That is, if it's not abused by just printing everything you look at then it should last quite a while between refills and toner. The smaller Samsung multi-function printer also had its image drum replaced after issues exceeding its paper page count. In general terms a small capacity colour printer probably equates to at least three to four times the running costs especially when it's just used for greyscale printing. So if anyone is doing multiple copying of documents or forms then I suggest you scan it first and print on the large printer from a scan on the Bowls Office PC. The scan icon has been placed on the task bar of the main office Windows computer for ease of use. Especially when it comes to common use forms like the bowlers booking sheet and membership forms. These should all have PDF format files located in a folder on the Office PC that members who manage bowling days can use. I will make sure they are also available on the bowling room computer as well which is

networked to that same printer. I have installed a small set of speakers on that computer for any new bowlers or members watching bowling tutorial videos or other information that resides on that same PC hard drive.

Those of you who might be waiting on NBN finally their website has projection plans working again for suburbs. This has been missing for years now after deadlines all past with hardly any of the objective dates met. So with that in mind keep a sceptical eye on any promise dates for your suburb. A lot of the older suburbs unfortunately seem to have been earmarked as fibre to the node which is hardly satisfactory but still better than nothing. This technology is a bit of pot luck, and depends very much on how good your copper lines are as to what speeds your internet may be. But in general terms this cost saving exercise is very short sighted by the government a bit like building the harbour bridge from each end and joining the last 5 mtr gap in the middle with wooden planks. It will eventually cost a lot more than to do a proper job in the first place. I was reading an article about a guy in Kiama who ran a tech

business from his house and finds he could only get a node connection in his street but 50 mtrs across the road they had fibre to the house. So in league with a neighbour across the road, invested thousands on elaborate WiFi set up and shares a service via WiFi with his neighbour just so he could get the speeds he required for his business.

Q1. *If the wrong lead delivers the jack, and both Leads have each played a bowl before the mistake is noticed, what should happen?*


Q2. *Who is responsible for ensuring the jack is properly centred?*


A1. *If after a bowl has been played by each team, a player notices that the wrong team has delivered the jack, play should continue in that order.*



