IS YOUR WILL PROPERLY WITNESSED?

Did you know that a person signing as a witness to a Will is usually disqualified from benefitting/inheriting under the Will and that this extends to the spouse of a witness? In New South Wales the Succession Act 2006 applies. The basic rule is that a witness to a Will should not be a beneficiary under the Will. However the spouse of a witness can also be disqualified from benefitting under the Will, the reasoning being that a witness has the potential to exert undue influence on the Testator or Testatrix who is making the Will. The witnesses to a Will signature should be completely independent and disinterested persons. There are exceptions to the rules but 'better safe than sorry'!

Make sure your Will is valid and properly witnessed.

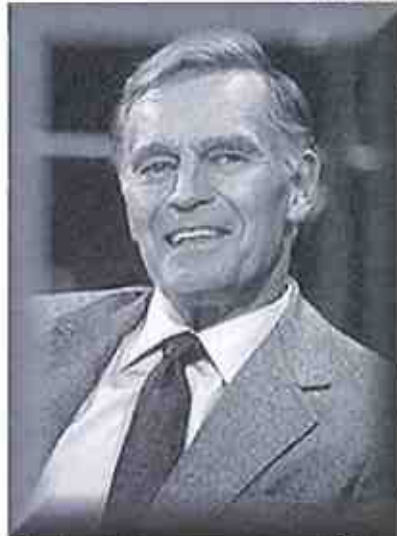

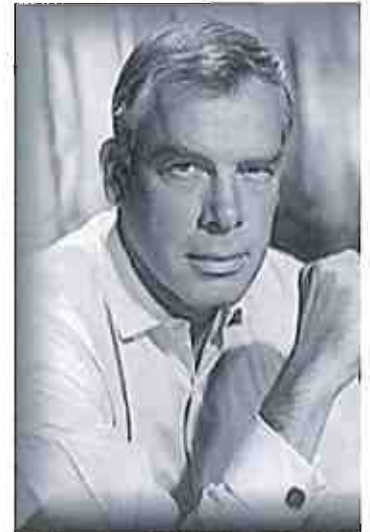

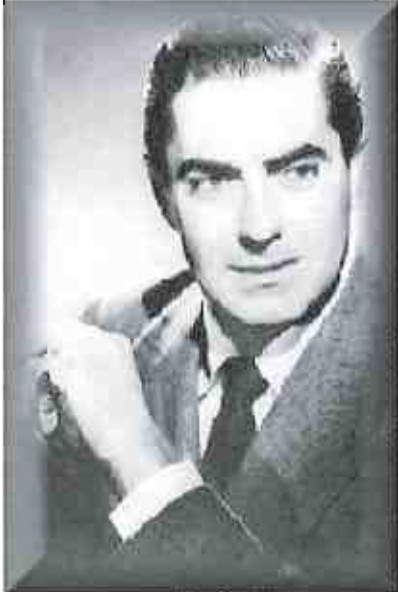
