Hockey Queensland Indoor Player Registration 2018/19

All players involved in Indoor competitions across Queensland will be required to complete an on-line registration on the IMG HQ Indoor database as per the outdoor registration process. Upon registration, players will be asked to pay the compulsory HQ Indoor Player Registration Fee.

All players

- who are participating in any Indoor competition across Queensland
- who intend on participating at any HQ Indoor Tournament
- who wish to be considered for selection for a Qld State Indoor Team

are required to register as an Indoor player to Hockey Queensland.

2017/18 Registration Fees:

(payable at time of registration by debit/credit card only directly to HQ)

- Junior Indoor Registration (Under 10yrs) \$6 (Inclusive of GST and surcharges) +\$2 for non-outdoor registered
- Junior Indoor Registration (10-18yrs) \$12 (Inclusive of GST and surcharges) +\$2 for non-outdoor registered
- Senior Indoor Registration (Over 18yrs) **\$17** (Inclusive of GST and surcharges) +\$2 for non-outdoor registered

Registered outdoor players will already have their email address in the online registration system, and will need to enter their personal password when prompted to complete their Indoor Registration (use the 'Forgotten Password' function to reset password if required).

Match Sheets

These will be available for each match at 'tech bench' and need to be completed prior to the match commencing. Refer section 4.3 of IIHL rules. A representative from each team is asked to sign the Match Sheet post game along with the umpires.

Representation Teams

Details of the age championships will be released via our website when information is to hand. Check under 'Rep Program' Tab – player nominations will open very soon and we are seeking Coaches, Managers & selectors to assist us.

General

- To maximize the playing time for the kids, we have set a very tight game schedule every 45 minutes, thus quick turn-around at half time and between games. No oncourt warmup, but the grassed external areas are available for physical warmup.
- We have a First Aid kit on-site, however no formal officer will be scheduled on duty.

Only REGISTERED Indoor players will be eligible to participate at a HQ Indoor competition or Tournament (including U13, U15 & U18 Team Challenges plus U21/Open Invitational) or for State Team selection.

Associations should ensure that they communicate the registration process and fee to all players playing Indoor in their competition/s.

Team changes or fill-ins

A reminder of our competition rules – players are only allowed to play in one (1) team per competition (ie. men, women or juniors), in addition, fill-in players can only be drawn from lower divisions up to maximum of four (4) times without being re-registered up.

Any new player registration must be provided to IIHL at least 24 hours before the game in which there are to play – this can be done via submitted updated Team Nomination Form or simply email with player details. Refer section 4.2.3 of IIHL rules.

Playing venue

Redbank Indoor facility

No food or drink purchased elsewhere to be taken into the complex, water is allowed. Any mess needs to be cleaned up prior to departure. Teams need to assist with setup or packup of the running boards etc.

The playing venues will generally be accessible 15 minutes before the 1st scheduled game and be closed within 15 mins after the last game.

A Venue Supervisor will be on duty whilst games are scheduled to ensure smooth running of games to our schedule plus oversee our occupancy in the hired premises.

Rules at a glance:

The rules of Indoor Hockey as set out by the International Hockey Federation are available on our website. This is a brief overview.

If you are used to Field hockey rules, generally anything disallowed in field hockey is also disallowed in Indoor hockey as well as:

- Players must not hit the ball (striking or slapping the ball using a swinging movement of the stick towards the ball)
- Players must not play the ball deliberately and hard into an opponent's stick, feet or hands with associated risk of injury when an opposition player is 'set', or blindly trying to play through an opposition player (the intent is for the player to use skill to go around or pass around opposition players)
- Players may not raise the ball off the pitch, except for a shot on goal (unintentional raises of less than 100mm with no opposition in playing distance are allowable)
- If a ball is raised as a shot on goal a defender may only raise their stick to stop the goal. Otherwise no raising of sticks is allowed
- Players may not play at the ball if laying on the pitch, or with a knee arm or hand on the pitch (other than the hand holding the stick)
- Players may not trap or hold the ball against the sideboard.
- There are no long corners, a ball pushed out by attacker or deflected by a goal keeper or unintentionally pushed out by a defender, results in a free hit to the defenders in line with where the ball crossed the backline at the level of the top of the circle. If a defender (not goal keeper) intentionally pushes the ball over the backline, it will be a penalty corner.

Obviously there are more rules but these are the obvious ones needed to be communicated to players.
