Junior Canberra	Compound & Recurve – Intermediates Longbow & Barebow Recurve & Compound – Open, Masters, Veterans, Veteran 70+, 20&U & Cadets

Rounds: (90 arrows on 122cm face)

Geelong (30m)	Longbow & Barebow - Intermediates All bow types – Cubs VI
Newcastle (20m)	All bow types – social & novice archers (This round is ineligible for records & medals)

Age Divisions:

Cubs

Anyone born in the year 2006 or since then i.e. they are younger

An athlete may compete in the cub class in tournaments when the competition takes place up to and in the year of his/her 13th birthday.

Intermediate

Anyone born in the years 2004 or 2005

An athlete may compete in the intermediate class in tournaments when the competition takes place up to and in the year of his/her 15th birthday.

Cadets

Anyone born in the years 2002 or 2003

An athlete may compete in the cadet class in tournaments when the competition takes place up to and in the year of his/her 17th birthday.

20 and Under (WA Junior)

Anyone born in the years 1999, 2000 or 2001

An athlete may compete in the junior class in tournaments when the competition takes place up to and in the year of his/her 20th birthday.

Open

Anyone born in 1970 to 1998 inclusive

An athlete of any age may compete in the open class in tournaments.

Masters

Anyone born in the years 1960 to 1969

An athlete may compete in the master's class in tournaments when the competition takes place up to and in the year of his/her 50th birthday and thereafter.

Veterans

Anyone born in 1950 to 1959 inclusive

An athlete may compete in the veteran's class in tournaments when the competition takes place up to and in the year of his/her 60th birthday and thereafter.

Veterans 70+

Anyone born in or before 1949 i.e. they are older

An athlete may compete in the veteran 70+ class in tournaments when the competition takes place up to and in the year of his/her 70th birthday and thereafter.

All Cub, Intermediate, Cadet and U20 archers may elect to compete in a higher age division, up to and including Open, by entering in the higher division, paying the appropriate fee and shooting the round for that division.

All Master, Veteran and Veteran+ archers may elect to compete in a lower age division, down to and including Open, by entering in the lower division and shooting the round for that division.
