HAMO'S TeeBeeCee REPORT

FINANCIAL

- P&L covering the first seven months of our 2012/13 financial year shows a loss of \$25,465 which is \$17,032 less than for the same period last year (i.e. loss \$42,497): Note however the net proceeds of \$34,667 received in May for the sale of gaming licences so the financial position is not improving.
- YTD Profit before allowing for depreciation is \$26,898.
- Total current assets of \$264,176 (including cash assets \$240,184) also shows a fairly sound position.

BAR, BBQ & GAMING

- Gaming Machine Net Clearances are up by \$1,530 (2%) but this is despite turnover decreasing by \$231,155 over the corresponding period last year.
- Bar receipts are down by \$20,959 (15%) continuing a disturbing trend (not unique to TBC).
- Numbers attending the Friday night BBQ have also been disappointing of late despite the provision of various specials added to the usual cost effective meals. Please join in with your friends for a reasonably priced "Wine and Dine" (maybe the new title for our Friday night dinner).

BOWLS & MEMBERSHIP (TB&MC)

- Position as @ 16/11/12 = Voting Membership 269, Social Membership 380, Total = 649.

MEN'S BOWLING CLUB (TMBC)

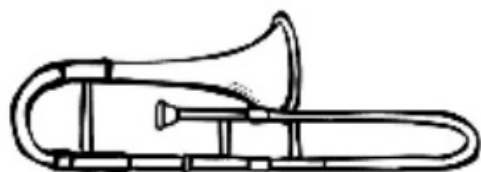

The achievement of winning six successive club major singles titles is a record that I expect to remain unchallenged in the future history of the Club. It is a record of achievement that would grace the honour boards of very few clubs in this State or in the Country for that matter: He won the Minor Singles, the Major Singles a total of 9 times, with 10 Club Pairs, 6 Club Triples and 7 Club Fours titles. In the majority of his wins he was the skip.

INNOVATION LAWN BOWLS

PART 3 DRAWING PRACTICE

Professional tennis players, golfers, and nearly every dedicated sportsmen and women spend endless hours with or without a coach hitting or delivering thousands of balls fine tuning their skills.

Over the past 40 years I have observed keen bowlers practicing alone on bowling greens and sometimes wonder whether they are simply enjoying themselves out in the sun exercising, or have some plan in their mind?

If the plan is to improve performance, the thought that practice makes perfect may ring a bell, however practice without an effective program will not achieve the objectives sought after.

The “**DRAWING PRACTICE**”© format featured below combined with the previous innovation articles published each month since June 2012 has the capacity to optimise your drawing skills so necessary to win important matches. Although the training formats illustrated in my innovation columns have worked exceptionally well for me and others committed to achieving higher bowling skills, consultation with a qualified coach to guide you through the formats is recommended to enhance your commitment to meet your objectives to.

The “DRAWING PRACTICE”© format explained.

This training program involves, drawing four bowls in a sequence to a jack progressively located on the minimum, medium, and maximum spots marked on a selected rink specified below.

- The **minimum length** segment. (Jack is placed on the 21m spot)

The player starts the **first end** by delivering four bowls, *two **back hands** and two **forehands** from the 2m (T) mark, to the jack placed on the **minimum length** spot further up the rink.

Following the four deliveries the player walks up to the head to determine the number of bowls that have scored.

One point is scored for each bowl at rest under 60cm from the jack.

Maximum score for each end is 4 and is entered on a scorecard prior to playing the second end as follows.

The player commences the **second end** by removing the jack by placing the mat on that spot to draw (return) to the jack placed on the 2m (T) spot. (The starting point)

Before walking back to the starting point, the player then places the jack on the medium length spot 27m from the 2m (T) spot starting point ready to play the **medium length**.

The player then walks back to the starting point to measure the shots for the second end and enters the score to complete the **minimum length** segment.

***Note:** alternating forehand and backhand deliveries is critical overall, as it provides additional data analysing the performance of both hands for further remedial training if required.

- The **medium length** segment. (Jack is placed on the 27m spot)

The player then repeats the process above to complete the **third and fourth ends** to complete the **medium length** segment.

- The **maximum length** segment. (Jack is placed on the maximum spot on the (T).

The player then repeats the process above to complete the **fifth and sixth ends** completing the **maximum length** segment to end the training session.

Scoring

Maximum score completing the six ends is 24. (4 for each completed end)

Score one point for each bowl at rest within 30cm or 60cm of the jack.

Use of a measuring stick 30cm for advanced measuring, or 60cm less critical measuring.

Note: For convenience, training alone, the mat may be used to measure non-critical measurements, as its dimensions 60cm length, and 30cm width may be utilised.

Accurate recording must be noted and maintained for all sessions, for monitoring trends and analysing performances, so important for grading and selection purposes.

Score guide: Interstate: 21 to 24 ; Zone: 17 to 20 ; Pennants 1/2: 14 to 16 ; Pennants 3/5: 11 to 13 ; Pennant 4/7: 5 to 10 ; Social: 1 to 4

Cooking Section - Recipe

Once again this year, I've had requests for my Vodka Christmas Cake recipe so here goes.

Please keep in your files as I am beginning to get tired of typing this up every year! (Made mine this morning!!!!)
1 cup sugar, 1 tsp. baking powder, 1 cup water, 1 tsp. salt , 1 cup brown sugar, Lemon juice, 4 large eggs, Nuts, 1 bottle vodka, 2 cups dried fruit.

Sample a cup of vodka to check quality. Take a large bowl, check the vodka again to be sure it is of the highest quality then Repeat. Turn on the electric mixer. Beat one cup of butter in a large fluffy bowl. Add 1 teaspoon of sugar. Beat again. At this point, it is best to make sure the vodka is still OK. Try another cup just in case. Turn off the mixerer thingy. Break 2 eggs and add to the bowl and chuck in the cup of dried fr...uit. Pick the fruit up off the floor, wash it and put it in the bowl a piece at a time trying to count it. Mix on the turner. If the fried druit getas stuck in the beaterers, just pry it loose with a drewscriver. Sample the vodka to test for tonsistency. Next, sift 2 cups of salt, or something. Check the vodka. Now shift the lemon juice and strain your nuts. Add one table. Add a spoon of sugar, or somefink. Whatever you can find. Greash the oven. Turn the cake tin 360 degrees and try not to fall over. Don't forget to beat off the turner. Finally, throw the bowl through the window. Finish the vodka and wipe the counter with cat :)
