A motion was moved that The Jascin Wahlin Perpetual Memorial Shield be awarded to a fourteen year old rider in the Far North Zone in accordance with the wishes of the Wahlin Family futher that the rider be nominated by his/her Club to be selected by the Zone Executive Committee after nominations close for the Zone Titles each year. The trophy is to be awarded at the Zone Title Meeting. A replica trophy is to be supplied by the Zone to the recipient of the award. The Perpetual to be stopped and displayed by the rider's Club. Carried.

JASCIN WAHLIN Memorial Trophy

(extract from 2001 FNQ Yearbook)

The Jascin Wahlin Memorial Trophy is given out each year to the rider considered as the best 14 year old in the Far North. Jascin Wahlin raced BMX since he was 6 years of age. He belonged to the Innisfail BMX Club.

During his racing career he represented his Club, Zone, State and Australia. His last major meeting before his death was the World Titles held in Brisbane in 1989, where he was narrowly beaten to a berth in the semi finals.

He always strived to be a better rider. Unfortunately he was taken from us all on January 24th, 1990. He is still sadly missed but his memory and his love for BMX lives on in this trophy.

On that very cold night approximately 20 interested people attended and formed a basic executive committee of President, Vice President and Secretary. A Treasurer was appointed on 28th June. The Atherton Shire Council has been extremely supportive of the initiative and offered a site off Grove Street for the track development. The site is bounded by Mazlin Creek and Prior's Creek. Club executive members presented a conceptual plan of the proposed development to a council meeting in 3rd August which was endorsed.

The club is incorporated in the state of QLD and also affiliated with BMX Qld. Track work commenced in late July and through the valuable assistance of the Council and a successful RLIP grant application, considerable progress was made in the first few months until the wet season intervened. Work resumed after the wet and progress of late has been rapid.

Today earthworks are substantially complete and there are temporary toilet facilities and a large undercover area. A clubhouse is soon to be erected on site. Work has commenced on construction of the start gate and perimeter security fencing is substantially complete. The site has reticulated water and power is being connected in the next two weeks.

Whilst the club has no rider members at this stage due to the non-existence of the track there is a large number of regular riders who travel to Cairns for Friday night racing. Most of these and many more will join the Atherton Club on or following our open day.

(extract from BMX National Newspaper 1992)

Weipa BMX started in the mid 1970's with a rough track in and around trees beside the town dam and behind the present track. This was under the fuidance of a Trevor was Raynor who was heavily involved in gymnastics here for many years. The track was moved to an area mid way between the football oval and the Mission River, when the other area was cleared to build a gym and Scout Hall but to my knowledge the track wasn't there for too long because of the sandy nature of the area. The track was then moved to an area near where the present speedway track is today. It was too far out of town. Around '79 -80 a group of parents got together and decided to form an official club, they also approached the company (Comalco) for an area to build a track and was given an area next to the football oval. The track was constructed with an ironstone base, this track was used until 1989, when it was decided to suspend racing on the track because no matter how much maintenance was carried out it was unsafe for racing. Racing was suspended in 1990 to concentrate on the building of the new track, after we finally got the okay to remove the pine trees from the area, which were not native to this part of the Cape. It took about 8 months, practically every second weekend with volunteer help and earth moving equipment from Comalco. By the end of the year the track finally took shape. The first couple of months of 1991 we cemented the starting gate and ramp and bitumen from the bottom of the ramp to the first jump. We started racing on the new track about May of 1991 on a Saturday afternoon, fortnightly in October 1991, in between race meetings, we erected the lights for our track which Comalco helped out with finance, mainly with the lights. For the last five weeks of our racing calendar, the club raced under lights on a Friday night. This year the club races every second Friday night except in the school holidays. There are 35 members in the club, ages range from 4 years to 13 years and in that number there are only five girls, who are just as competitive as the boys. During the year we run two enduros similar to motor bike endures, which is open to any child who has a BMX bike. Between the years of 1981 and 1983 the club affiliated with the Nth. Queensland and Queensland BMX Associations and a couple of our senior riders were licensed and did compete with clubs outside, but with rising costs and wanting lights for the old track, we are no longer members of outside associations.
